### Proceedings

The National Shelter NFI CCCM Sector coordination meeting was held on 6 June 2023 in IOM Office in Islamabad. The meeting was organized on hybrid model by inviting colleagues online and in person. After the formal introduction of all IOM Staff and all meeting Participants, Mr. Abbas Khan shared the agenda of the meeting. Detailed discussion has been done on the meeting agenda. Agenda points along with discussion and conclusion/recommendation are given below.

<b>Ongoing Flood Response and Gap Analysis</b>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>Mr. Abbas shared that the Sector has reached 47% out of 100%. The allotted percentage was 30% and progress has been noticed in recent days.</li> <li>It was shared that the shelter sector is still facing challenges considering the capacity of sector partners.</li> <li>Flood extent between 1 July till 31<sup>st</sup> August 2022 have been shared with meeting participants and most vulnerable regions were also shared likewise southern Punjab and KPK.</li> </ul>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>It was communicated that the sector needs more commitments, funds and mobilization of resources.</li> <li>In terms of preparedness, we need to give more focus to the vulnerable areas.</li> <li>It was recommended to monitor and refer to Pakistan Metrological department website for authentic information regarding extent of rain and floods forecast.</li> </ul>
<b>Contingency planning Monsoon 2023 preparedness update</b>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>Brief of Sector action implementation plan starting initiated by OCHA in March. Activation of strategic coordination which is planned in June was also shared in the meeting. Similarly, other related timelines were also shared.</li> <li>It was shared that 75 Organizations including NGOs, CBOs and INGOs have the stocks available and can respond to Monsoon. Moreover, the number of stands by stocks have been shared as well.</li> </ul>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>While sector will be able to assist 2.8 million through available standby stocks, considering the planning figure of potential 10 Million to be affected and 4 million to be targeted, the sector still needs commitments from partners</li> </ul>

	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Additionally, it was communicated that One kit is consider for one household. And as per international standard one repair tool kit in emergency is for 5 households.</li> <li>• The forecasted number of households were also shared that could be affected by Monsoon this year in Pakistan. The forecasted figure is around 10 million people.</li> </ul>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• It was advised and requested to reach out to more partners and to share information.</li> <li>• Abbas to share the detailed analysis stocks and breakdown with respect of districts with shelter partners.</li> <li>• It was recommended to start strong advocacy for the Shelter sector to be able to respond to the large number forecasted individuals that could be affected this year.</li> </ul>
<b>Sector Coordination Performance Monitoring (7 core functions)</b>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Abbas shared the shelter sector performance monitoring with the participants where he shared the 7 core functions which is basically evaluation which later will be shared with UN OCHA.</li> <li>• The 7 core functions included Supporting service delivery, Informing HC/HCT strategic decision making, Planning and strategy development, Advocacy, Monitoring and Reporting, Contingency planning/preparedness and Accountability to affected population.</li> </ul>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• information will be shared along with session/meeting in coming weeks.</li> </ul>
<b>CCCM updates</b>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Navin shared CCCM updates.</li> <li>• It was shared that IOM is also focusing on capacity building of CCCM partners and government partners who have been engaged in response previously.</li> <li>• Navin has also shared site improvement process in general starting from need assessment through consultation to Monitoring tools to community.</li> <li>• It was discussed that since the CCCM project is short term and we must have to assure the sustainability of project in future.</li> <li>• Additionally, it was shared that IOM encourage and ensure the gender participation and good number of females are IOM cash for work beneficiary.</li> </ul>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Navin shared that IOM intends to start capacity building training around CCCM in KPK and Balochistan while taking in loop the NDMA.</li> <li>• CCCM is also in process of identification of evacuation sites in case of floods.</li> </ul>
<b>IOM Common Pipeline</b>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Mr. Ibtehaj has shared the IOM common pipeline updates with the meeting participants.</li> </ul>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Partners were requested to share questions, recommendation, and suggestion regarding kits.</li> </ul>



	<ul style="list-style-type: none"><li>• It was shared that since September 2022 IOM has distributed 144051 household have been given the stock through IOM Common pipeline.</li><li>• Additionally, it was shared that IOM Common pipeline has distributed these kits in 4 provinces and 27 districts.</li><li>• Similarly, the current distribution of common pipeline has also been shared in the meeting.</li><li>• Furthermore, it was communicated to the meeting participants that IOM common pipeline is currently in the process of procuring an additional number of NFI kits, shelter toolkits and emergency shelter kits.</li><li>• The standardization and harmonization of different kits were discussed as well.</li></ul>	
<b>Housing, Recovery and Reconstruction</b>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"><li>• Sumaira has shared that in Baluchistan the bank allocated 400 million USD, out of which 80,000USD allocated for housing and 350,100 houses can be reconstructed and rehabilitated. Which is not enough to cover the load in Balochistan.</li><li>• Najaf has shared that in Sindh people housing private company aims 21.1 million houses to be reconstructed for 24 flood affected districts in Sindh.</li><li>• One designated organization will take the lead in housing reconstruction in Balochistan.</li><li>• With this Project, they will make sure that all the beneficiaries have their bank accounts.</li><li>• The project will also consider organization who are actively involved in reconstruction while considering people with disability.</li><li>• The amount will be transferred to beneficiary's accounts in 4 trans and all banks have been taken on board.</li><li>• Beneficiary who has lost her/his house in 2022 are eligible for the housing reconstruction programme.</li></ul>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"><li>• IOM to share more information on housing reconstruction project once received to them.</li></ul>



<b>Presentation by Muslim Hands-on Shelter Programme</b>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"><li>• Shah Khalid from Muslim hands shared the number of beneficiaries assisted by Muslim hands since last year, which is 1.2 million who have received foods, medical service NFI etc.</li><li>• Village development Model have been shared with the meeting participants.</li><li>• Additionally Model comparison were also shared along with the targeted locations.</li><li>• Furthermore, 3 structure of houses was also shared by Muslim Hand representative.</li><li>• Lastly lesson learnt and replication have been shared in detailed.</li></ul>
