

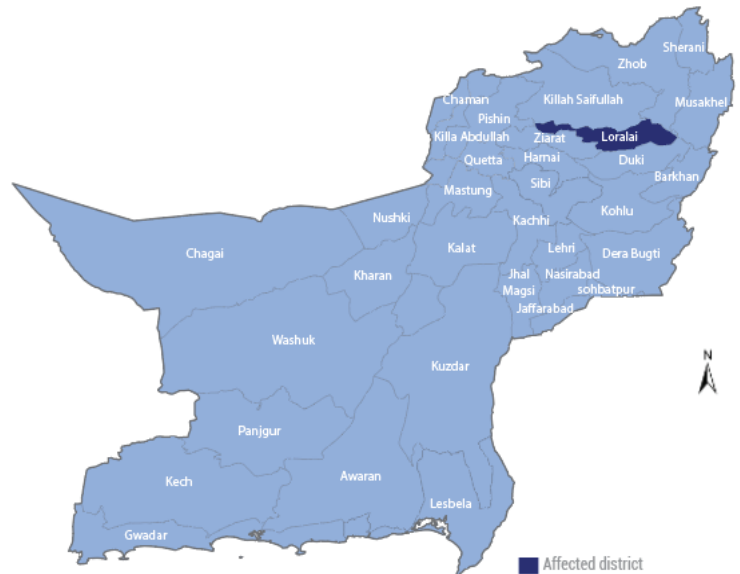
Situation

Loralai is one of the nine districts declared as calamity hit by the Provincial Disaster Management Authority (PDMA) following the recent rain spell in the Baluchistan Province. Responding to the emerging situation and to assess the damages and support emergency response, on 22nd August as UN OCHA-led Observatory Mission participated by Deputy Commissioner PHF, Qatar Charity and TKF.

Key Finding

- Standing Water and Road Damage: No standing water or major road damage declared. However, some roads were severely affected by the heavy rains and were temporarily restored for the traffic in the various areas and union councils of District Loralai
- No displaced population in or from the area.
- Some houses in 13 Union Councils are partially damaged due to heavy rain. Majority of houses are weakened by heavy rain and cracked walls. Residents fear that another heavy rainfall could cause roofs and walls to collapse.
- All health facilities are operational.
- All education facilities are functional; no disruptions reported.
- After the heavy rain and flash flooding on August 8th, all basic facilities have been reported as functional by district authorities.
- Markets and small village shops are fully operational, meeting most of the community's needs.
- Significant crop damage reported in the climate-affected Union Councils of Loralai district.
- Communication networks in the district are fully functional.
- Limited humanitarian assistance provided by INGOs; no major protection concerns reported.
- Support for Vulnerable Groups: No support provided yet as of August 22, 2024. The livelihoods of the community have been affected by heavy rain, and they need livelihood support.
- Awareness, Government departments, DDMA, and NGOs are effectively providing advocacy and awareness on the upcoming monsoon and weather forecasts.
- No outbreaks reported due to stagnant water.
- WASH Facilities partially affected in the district.
- One child was injured; overall situation is normal.
- Livestock were heavily affected by flash flooding following the heavy rain.
- The health facilities is stable and normal.
- Refugees, The situation is generally normal, but the livelihoods of vulnerable families have been affected by heavy rain requiring support
